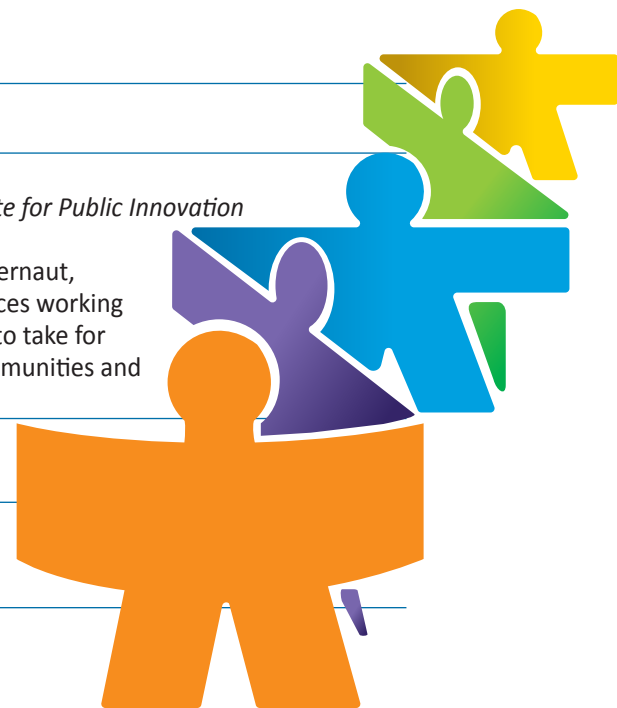

	<p>Too many children are born into circumstances that do not provide them with a reasonable opportunity to make a good start in life. By the time Australian children start school, clear inequities in their development and wellbeing are already evident - driven by their life circumstances coupled with the failure of health, welfare and educational systems to ameliorate these impacts despite enormous investment and effort. Disadvantaged circumstances for children lead to developmental inequities and differential outcomes that are unjust, unnecessary and preventable. Yet the importance of early life for children's later child health and development has become increasingly clear. So - what can we do to deliver on the promise of early childhood?</p>
