Roadmap Alignment – A Strong Community

Why it's important – Community gateways, for the purpose of this project, are defined as designated places in the community whose sole purpose is for people to come together. They are safe, inviting spaces where people feel accepted and where resources are made available. Community gateways in Logan include neighbourhood centres, school-based community hubs, maternity and child health hubs and neighbourhood centres.

This project wants to see the Logan flourish through a strong and connected network of diverse formal community gateways delivering connection and resources to the community members who need them. Underpinning this project is the commitment to unite as a cohesive voice of gateways in Logan so that we can influence policy decision makers, funders and investors and gain commitment for the investment needed to make this vision possible.

Aim of the project – This project maps all of the community gateways in Logan, to build a clear picture of what is happening within them and what's needed to amplify their efforts within the community. Closer collaboration between gateways, strengthening the network, reducing overheads and working to increase funding are all aims of this important project.

Partners involved – Logan's community gateways, local Aboriginal Elders, local government, Griffith University, Logan Together Leadership Table, and Logan Together Backbone Team.

Where we're at – The Community Gateways project outline will go out to all of the connected partners and once approved, implementation can commence.

Community engagement is also an important part of the progress from here, and questions have been prepped to provide all gateways to ask their communities. From here, we will have a clear evidence base of community aspirations for their gateways, as well as how valuable they are as connectors.
