OPENING SESSION	
Acknowledgment of Yugambah and Jagera people, sorry business and welcome and introductions	<p>Matthew Cox welcomed everyone to the October meeting of the Logan Together Action Group.</p> <p>Tania Collins-McCoy provided an acknowledgment to country.</p>
REVIEW PREVIOUS ACTIONS/DECISIONS	
Minutes and actions from the previous meeting	<p>The minutes from the combined September meeting were confirmed. Actions from previous meetings are completed or included in agenda below except for Induction Champion which is to be carried forward to the November meeting.</p> <p>Matthew Cox clarified the integrated agenda approach. On the agenda document the items in bold are for this meeting and greyed out information is for other Logan Together groups/forums. The Live Register covers our priorities with a life stages approach. If anyone thinks something is missing please advise the Logan Together Backbone team. The third document is the Monthly Report which provides updates on projects. Yolanda van Gellecum asked about background documents for each project. Sam Pearson advised that the Backbone Team is putting together some more comprehensive information for each project – currently some have a lot of detail, others not so much.</p>

STRATEGIC DISCUSSION ITEMS

The Leadership Table:
launching into the next 5
years

Matthew Cox advised that Federal and State Government funding for Logan Together had been extended for a further 5 years from 1 July. After 3 years operation, over the last 6 months we have started thinking about collaboration arrangements that support the Logan Together movement. Some work has been done on the Leadership Table, its' membership, role in setting agendas and responding to issues referred to them. About 50% of the Leadership Table group had been attending consistently. Work is being done on refreshing the membership and this process is about half-way through. The Leadership Table now has about 13 people confirmed as members and there are a number of vacancies to be filled with priority members. The Leadership Table is wanting to include more community members and is going through a process to do that. There won't be a November Leadership Table meeting and by December there will be a new membership group. A one day retreat is being arranged and this will include covering the commitment required.

Health priorities

Matthew Cox advised that the Logan Together movement has been trying to encourage a more strategic approach across health partners. Health partners are now asking what the priorities are and have begun a priority setting process. The Leadership Table has had a look at this and they now want to get feedback from the Action Group. Matthew referred to the document – Health Reform priorities – preliminary list (as attached) and asked if there was anything missing, do they seem right, which have higher priority?

Ideas raised in the discussion included:

- reduce wait times for paediatric – understand what is happening, stocktake/data to capture this including the impact of referrals to private services, is there a paediatrician who works in Logan?
- one of our priorities is to try to engage with Maternity Hubs, not wanting to take work away from mid-wives but to do a warm hand over to better support families
- NDIS – not sure if this is covered - what allied health services are available for families who don't quite make the NDIS eligibility, also an issue for refugees who have high needs – also sometimes no follow through support.
- CARS – Community Allied Health service
- diagnostic issues - GPs not picking up health issues and making referrals on to Allied Health or Paediatrician
- skills of GPs with early childhood
- health literacy can be a barrier for parents – not sure how to talk to the GP, services sometimes give parents information to take to the Dr, parents frustrated, more health education for parents
- impact of mental health issues, trauma for parents and competing priorities
- need for dietician services
- families don't see same GP consistently – GPs can then be reluctant to send off referrals

From the discussion Matthew added the following priorities to the list:

- Asylum seeker or other ineligible families (e.g. Pasifika)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dietician services • General – relationship based care and follow through. <p>Matthew identified relative priorities via votes and the top ones were: link services to maternity hubs, reduce wait times, multi-disciplinary hubs, outreach and screening strategies. He advised that the list will be updated and will be referred to the couple of different forums for our health partners. Also some workshops will be held in February/March. There was a willingness to do collaborative work on this and set out a program for change however there were a lot of systemic, agency related boundaries to work through.</p>
Annual Planning Process	<p>Matthew Cox explained the proposed planning processes as in the attached document. He indicated that a Roadmap refresh was due and likely to start in November. The inclusion of an Annual plan was new along with a Partnership process with government and an Operational Plan for the Backbone Team.</p>
Emerging Issue: Shopping centre traps for vulnerable families	<p>Penny Goodall advised that the Backing Young Parents Working Group had raised issues regarding businesses enticing vulnerable families into high cost financial commitments e.g. children’s photos/ glamour photos/study. The result is often a large debt. Penny suggested that we have developed good relationships with local shopping centres and wondered if we could have a go at tackling the shopping centres to build awareness of the issue. We discussed perhaps approaching one e.g. Logan Central and see what we can do.</p> <p>There was further discussion about a range of financial products that present issues for people in our community including Afterpay and Payday Lenders. Ellen Ferris advised that she is a member of the Logan Financial Literacy Action Group (FLAG) and issues such as this had frequently been raised and there had been some action and advocacy however new products and approaches are often unregulated. FLAG is facilitating a workshop for community services workers on Afterpay on 21 November.</p> <p>Matthew Cox suggested targeting the Directors of the shopping centres from a corporate social responsibility perspective but we need to come up with a policy position first.</p> <p>In further discussion Carrie Rose advised that there may be some scope in getting financial wellbeing messages into the kindy/early years education between Rosie’s and Daisy Hill State School.</p> <p>Actions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ellen Ferris is to raise at the next FLAG meeting to seek a response – in terms of a policy position and willingness of FLAG members to work with members of the Backing Young Parents working group/Action group on the issue. • Table Financial Literacy as a matter for the forward agenda of this group with an invitation to FLAG to join the Action Group to workshop issues and identify possible actions/escalation.

Logan Together Live Register and Project Status Updates	Matthew presented The Logan Together Live Register and Project Status Report (see attached) If anyone has anything to add please advise Sam Pearson, Logan Together Backbone Team samantha.pearson@griffith.edu.au
First Five Forever	<p>Marnie Julin provided an update on the First Five Forever project which has a focus on delivering early years literacy sessions - see attached. She advised that the project had been running since 2015 and its' value had been recognised by allocation of funding on an ongoing basis together with some additional funding to put play based resources in libraries. An additional person will be recruited to the project soon. Some of the things that the First Five Forever team have been doing include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Purposeful programming in library and community spaces, focussing on language as a priority and by connecting with and supporting families in the parenting and carer journey – better practice across programs through evaluation and trusted relationships with families. • Investing in a lot of professional development, this has also lead to greater reach of families. Doing workforce development with Library staff. • Hosting purposeful outreach events where families get lots of takeaway ideas for learning in the home. • Working with local Early Childhood Education and Care Services – e.g. Little Libraries book swap. • Developing a suite of resources that can be shared across the City (and Qld) that support early literacy. • Regular visit to new mums groups across the City. <p>If Action Group members want to engage with First Five Forever F5F about doing things in their services contact Marnie marniejulin@logan.qld.gov.au</p>
Going to Kindy and Enrol in Prep Campaign	<p>Matthew Cox advised that the Going to Kindy and Enrol in Prep Campaign Strategic Advisory Group which includes the Dept of Education had met once and had identified the following priorities for the next 12 months:</p> <p><u>Top Place</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improving the cultural skills and appropriateness of mainstream kindies • Alternative kindy models including bush kindies <p><u>Second Place</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First Nations Early Hub • Transport to kindy/kindy uber

- Early years workforce development (including building cultural awareness capability, and attracting, retaining and supporting First Nations workers)
- Home based programs

Third Place

- Mobile/Pop Up kindies (Save the Children do something similar outside Logan)
- Extended hours kindies and kindy delivered at other times e.g. holidays and weekends
- Intergenerational kindies/learning

Fourth Place

- Kindy scholarships
- Quality family day care models
- Public education campaign (ensuring messaging reaches and is appropriate for First Nations children and families)

A similar discussion has occurred with Warril Yari-Go and they identified priorities as:

- More Aboriginal owned/controlled kindies particularly in Beenleigh and Eagleby
- Support for families to attend mainstream kindies
- First Nations cultural curriculum and programming from birth through early learning and school
- More Aboriginal Educators and professional development opportunities
- Early Childhood Workforce to embed Indigenous knowledge and training how to work with community
- Ensuring that First Nations children and families feel same with the education system
- Models that include strong family involvement and family leadership
- More playgroups for First Nations children and families
- Mentoring and support for families to enrol in kindergarten similar to the RASEC model
- Parent groups coming together regularly around early learning in their areas.

Belinda Brown advised this was an opportunity to start an asset mapping exercise and collected feedback from small group discussions at the meeting relevant to the topics of: Playgroups, Kindy delivered differently, Transition to school, Child development and early literacy, Inclusion Support, Trauma informed and Everything else.

Action: Belinda Brown will do further work on this project and come back to the December meeting.
