<b>OPENING SESSION</b>	
Acknowledgment of Yugambeh and Jagera people, sorry business and welcome and introductions	Matthew Cox welcomed everyone to the meeting. He acknowledged the observers and advised that we are working towards having a consistent membership group. There is a process for new members to join and all members are expected to participate in action or working groups associated with the Action Group's priorities.  Angela TuiSamoa provided an acknowledgement to country.
<b>1. REVIEW PREVIOUS ACTIONS/DECISIONS</b>	
<b>1.1 Minutes and actions from the previous meeting</b>	The minutes from the May meeting were confirmed. Actions from that meeting have been completed or are on the agenda for today's meeting.
<b>2. STRATEGIC DISCUSSION ITEMS</b>	
<b>2.1 Logan Together Integrated Governance Model</b>	Mathew Cox spoke about the Logan Together Collaboration Model document and the structured way that priorities will now get presented into the Leadership Table. The Leadership Table role will be an authorising, unblocking one and the Action group will take on the operational action role. The Action Group will coordinate associated projects and refer to the Leadership Table when needed e.g. endorsement, funding and decisions. He advised that the Leadership Table Terms of Reference have been reviewed and are almost finalised.

	<p>Matthew provided an orientation to the new look agenda and supporting documents for today’s meeting. There is a common agenda format between the Action Group and the Leadership Table. The format of the agenda and supporting documents - Live Register and Project Report will provide visibility of the various working groups and committees that are part of Logan Together – what they are working on, the issues being considered.</p> <p>In response to a question Sharon Worboys advised that the Logan Together website will be updated to include these documents.</p> <p>Matthew thanked everyone for contributing to the development of the documents</p> <p>We than had some discussion about how we include what is happening on the ground and getting community voices here. We spoke about possible cross over membership from Warril Yari-Go and other community groups Also we discussed some possible ways of bringing forward issues that we see in our everyday work and giving sufficient time to properly workshop them. Options might include longer or separate meetings or meetings which are a combination of workshop and information agenda items. Having some time for the project groups to have discussions was another option raised, however most of the project groups include people who are not members of the Action Group and would not be present. Matthew indicated that we need people to lead on some discussion items and if there is an issue in the community the Action Group can arrange time on the agenda and lead an in depth discussion and we might have one of these items each month. As we are an Action Group taking the issue from discussion to action is our role.</p> <p>Sue Jankovic referred to the decision brief document and advised that this can be used to either to shape up the item, escalate to Leadership Table or refer to another of the Logan Together groups as included in the Logan Together Collaboration Model. Support to do this is available from the Logan Together Backbone Team.</p> <p>The Action Group endorsed the revised Terms of Reference.</p>
<p><b>2.2 Logan Together Live Register</b></p>	<p>Sue Jankovic presented the Live Register which is an extension of the former traffic light report. The Live Register has all Logan Together projects on one sheet. There are a couple of projects that the Backbone Team needs to check on to see if they are happening/what progress has been achieved. We will need to consider how we decide which project(s) we present on as we can’t get through all of them each month. Also Sue encouraged project groups to think about how to connect with other projects including those may be happening in the community outside of Logan Together. Maddison Watson advised that Council could help with this. Matthew Cox suggested that if another project is important to the Logan Together project we might work towards incorporating it or if less relevant it may be just about finding out about it.</p> <p>Sue also presented the partially completed Project Update. This will be updated to include all projects and along with the Live Register will be presented at the Action Group meeting each month.</p> <p><b>Action: Action Group Members who have responsibility for a project are to send Sue an e-mail update so the Register and Project Update can be updated.</b></p>

	<p>We had some further discussion about streamlining things, perhaps having a small number of groups focussed on topics such as Under 8's, DV, and Parents. Also we spoke about the challenges in deciding who is going to be in the working groups and historically our group experience has been that lots of issues are raised but we have not then had people then commit to taking them forward into action.</p> <p>Sue Jankovic suggested that we see how the new rigour and processes associated with the governance work in relation to working groups before making changes. Matthew Cox observed that there is agreement about supporting the working groups and over the next few meetings we need to share what they are working on so Action Group members know and can get involved if they want. Action Group members were encouraged to give this further thought as the new processes evolve. If anyone has a suggestion please advise Sue Jankovic or Ellen Ferris.</p> <p>We also spoke about the importance of an appropriate induction process so new members understand how the group works. For organisations that have representation on this group as well as the Leadership Table it is important for the Leadership Table representative to communicate with people in their organisation including their representative on this group which will help build the understanding of the Logan Together movement and what we are working on.</p>
<p><b>3. PROJECT UPDATES</b></p>	
<p><b>3.1 Project Working Groups</b></p>	<p>Children Together – Carrie Rose advised that Charter and Tool Kit are done and sought endorsement from the Action Group to refer it to the Leadership Table seeking decisions about further progression forward, some funding, who's going to do what etc. This was approved. This project is to be placed on the agenda for the August meeting after it has been to the Leadership Table.</p>
<p><b>3.2 Going to Kindy and Enrol in Prep Evaluations</b></p>	<p>Belinda Brown was not able to be here today. Matthew Cox spoke about the 2 documents which provide an evaluation of two important Logan Together public campaigns – Going to Kindy and Enrol in Prep. He advised that in the second half of 2019 these campaigns will be escalated. Penny Goodall advised that a Family Kindy Guide has been produced and 54 service partners had been trained in Kindy Conversations. Matthew advised that Enrol to Prep has been more of an awareness campaign about the basic arrangements for Prep enrolment e.g. having a birth certificate. It has been identified that there are about 300-400 kids in Logan where Prep enrolment has been delayed due to hurdles. The evaluations showed that both campaigns are valued and are having positive effects including raising the value of Kindy and Prep. However, we need better data collection to assess the effectiveness. Penny advised that if anyone wants to be part of the working group let her know and it does not have to be someone who is already a member of this group, it can be another person from member organisations. Matthew advised that there are approximately 4,500 Kindy aged kids in Logan and we think there are about 3,000 are attending Kindy. The aim is to increase that to about 85% so that's about 1,000 more kids in Kindy. <b>Action: Put on the agenda for July for a longer discussion.</b></p>
<p><b>3.3 Workforce Development Initiative</b></p>	<p>Sue Jankovic advised that the current status of this project is on the Monthly Report. The details are:</p> <p>In August 2018, Logan Together hosted a workshop for stakeholders in the Early Childhood Industry to conceptualise workforce development issues in Logan and identify current gap and opportunities. The workshop was successful however the project was slow to progress due to staffing issues and competing demands.</p>

	<p>A revised stakeholder group was brought together in April 2019 to re-ignite the project and to discuss a potential new funding opportunity. The stakeholder group agreed that a market led proposal should be developed as a starting point, and that strategically it made sense to align the proposal with this potential new opportunity. This resulted in a variation to the project as described below. Preliminary ideas for a model were also obtained from the group at this time.</p> <p>A smaller group of members then nominated to work together to develop the draft proposal. They met in May to scope an ideal model and to identify target groups, learning and development pathways and critical success factors. The group is scheduled to meet again in June to focus on the delivery components of the project including resourcing and responsibilities. After this time the draft proposal will be circulated to the larger stakeholder group for consideration.</p>
<p><b>4. INFORMATION SHARING &amp; GENERAL BUSINESS</b></p>	
<p><b>4.1 Warril Yari-Go Requests Protocol</b></p>	<p>Matthew Cox advised that the protocols and process for seeking advice and decisions from Warril Yari-Go are in the process of being worked out. Aunty Faith provided an update about Warril Yari-Go. This is a group that developed out of ChangeFest which provided a platform for Aboriginal and Torres St Islander people and helped establish where they sit in Logan Together and the community. Warril Yari-Go is in the process of working out protocols and processes. Many members of Warril Yari-Go are visitors to this country. They are working through a process to talk with the Traditional Owners and see if they give them permission to speak on their behalf. There are also some conversations to be had with other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander groups. The idea is that Warril Yari-Go will be the gatekeeper. ChangeFest empowered Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and Warril Yari-Go is operating with a structure where their own business is considered first and then meetings are opened up to other business. If we want to have a meeting with Warril Yari-Go – refer to Jen Kyriacou, she'll refer on and Warril Yari-Go will then consider their priorities. Matthew confirmed that Jen will collate the issues to be considered by Warril Yari-Go. In the information provided Jen will need to know the benefit for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. The Decision Brief document can be used for this. Aunty Faith advised that Gunya Meta, Logan Elders, Beenleigh Housing and Development Company and Torres Strait Elders are members of Warril Yari-Go.</p>
<p><b>4.2 Logan Together Events Calendar</b></p>	<p>Sharon Worboys advised that the Backbone Team has been working on an Events Calendar and this will be circulated feedback. Once finalised it will go on the website.</p> <p>Aunty Faith Green advised that NAIDOC was coming up and all stall holder places had been filled. The main celebration is at Gould Adams Park on 9 July. She encouraged Action Group members to attend and take the opportunity to form and create relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.</p>
<p><b>4.3 LLA, CfC, Early Years Networks</b></p>	<p><b>Browns Plains LLA</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ties Warta was not available for this meeting. At the April Action Group meeting three issues from this LLA were identified for escalation to Leadership Table: youth mental health, access to allied health professionals and financial literacy. <b>Action: Ellen Ferris is to talk with Ties about completing the Decision Brief for each of these issues for escalation to the Leadership Table.</b></li> </ul>



	<p><b>Logan/Beenleigh LLA</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Finn Murphy advised that the <b>Logan Youth Homelessness working group</b> met last week. The Concertina card has been endorsed by the group and also the Logan Elders and the group was now working together to decide the content to go on the card. The group has been successful in securing some funding from Council and it is expected that the Concertina Card will be finalised in October. Finn proposed ideas to the working group going forward outside of the card and whether the group is interested in forming an alliance with the existing network but has not received much of a response. She proposes that the group be linked to the Logan Youth Services Network or Logan Housing and Homelessness Network. Aunty Faith Green advised that Gunya Meta was interested in being involved. Finn and Maddison Watson are to catch up to discuss further.</li> <li>• The LLA Forum with a CALD focus was held last week. There were a number of good presenters. Challenges identified for the Pasifika community included under-representation in tertiary education, being engaged in unskilled and low-income occupations, youth at risk of experiencing mental illness at a higher rate than the general population, disproportionate levels of chronic disease and over-representation in youth justice. For the other CALD communities issues identified included lack of community understanding for non-English speaking families, not enough supports for women and children when CALD services want to make referrals, group based work needs to be culturally and linguistically tailored, more services need to work collaboratively, more grouped based programs are required. Finn would like the LLA to be included on the Logan Together events calendar.</li> </ul>
<p><b>4.4 Thriving Families</b></p>	<p>Di Townsend spoke about the <i>Thriving Families</i> initiative to be delivered by YFS. This will trial a new model for working with homeless families. To achieve this, YFS are developing a service model to be delivered by a skilled multi-disciplinary team. The model will incorporate a structured approach to bring together the elements: Engagement &amp; motivation, Supportive housing, Safety, Practical supports, Skills building, Therapeutic services, Financial self-sufficiency, Parenting &amp; child development and Social connections. The hope is that once people have learned the skills and developed confidence they can then take those skills into other areas of their life. YFS will align the project with Sure Steps under the one Manager. The criteria for referral is Families with children aged 5 or under where the family is either homeless for the first time or at risk of homelessness and the family members have a genuine interest in the program offerings beyond housing and are willing to take part. The same criteria as housing and public works applies in regard to visa requirements. The program is not suitable for repeatedly homeless, suffering psychosis, suicide ideation, or with current statutory involvement with Child Safety or involved with another homelessness service. The program will start in August and referral can be made through the YFS portal. It is anticipated that the program will work with- 40 families over 12 months with an initial case load of 20. Matthew Cox suggested something to think about is reserving some places to be filled by partners. Aunty Faith Green enquired about whether the program was tailor made for cultural groups and with appropriate around services.</p> <p>Mathew thanked Di for the brief and indicated that it is important to have a wider discussion on this as a system reform and moving money into integrated service delivery. This is to be scheduled later this year for a longer discussion. It may be a specific session separate to an Action Group meeting.</p>
<p><b>4.5 DSS Post-Election</b></p>	<p>Tania Collins-McCoy congratulated the group for holding the meeting in a community setting and thanked Aunty Faith and Gunya Meta for hosting.</p>

	Tania advised there had been some small machinery of government changes for DSS post-election but these were not likely to impact Logan. The new Minister is Senator Anne Ralston and Michelle Landry is the Assistant Minister.
<b>4.6 General Business</b>	Aunty Faith Green advised that Gunya Meta meeting/office space is available to hire @\$30 per hour.
4.7 Next meeting – date, time, venue	<p>Penny Goodall thanked Ellen Ferris for the work she has done with the Action Group as this is her last meeting representing The Salvation Army and she is retiring on 30 June. Ellen will continue the Secretariat role as a volunteer and the Logan Together Backbone team will provide support including when Ellen is not available.
