<p>1. Acknowledgment of Country, Welcome, Introductions</p>	<p>Finn Murphy provided an acknowledgement of country focussing on the Five Dimensions of Reconciliation . Finn advised that The Benevolent Society had recently developed their Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). Matthew Cox advised that the Logan Together Backbone Team had been considering the possibility of developing a whole of Logan Together movement RAP.</p> <p>Matthew welcomed everyone and facilitated introductions. Welcome to new members Sue Jankovic (recently appointed Deputy Director) and Victoria Parker (Communications Lead) from the Logan Together Backbone Team.</p>
<p>2. Minutes from the previous Connect</p>	<p>The minutes from the previous meeting were accepted.</p> <p>Previous Actions - All previous actions which are due for review are included in the items below, are on the reverse page or have been completed. Susan Cary noted that 2018 AEDC results have now been released.</p>
<p>3. Getting to Action – Chapter Operations</p>	<p>Ellen Ferris referred to the standing agenda item - Getting to Action which is one of the Chapter’s priorities and she spoke about the challenges faced in achieving progress given the volume of change in attendance at meetings. Given we are reviewing our governance and the role the approach we take to Chapter operations may change.</p>

<p>4. Logan Together Governance – Role of Child and Family Chapter, New Terms of Reference, Chapter Direction and Priorities 2019</p>	<p>Matthew Cox took the group through the Key Questions document and the answers. Discussion included - the linkages with LLAs and format of engagement and learning forums, sharing information, consideration of maybe starting this for 6 June LLA, considering audiences to engage with other than the sector e.g. business, adding ‘action’ to the Chapter’s role in regard to the relationship with Leadership Table, the role of people in the Chapter as connectors, transparency and measurement of success and outcomes. Matthew advised that Logan Together’s data program had experienced some slippage however the progress and outcomes including for new initiatives such as <i>Right at Home</i> is on the radar screen.</p>

	<p>Matthew led the group through the proposed Terms of Reference. A few amendments were suggested. Recognising the increased focus on action, a majority of Chapter members agreed that the Chapter will now be known as the Logan Together Action Group.</p> <p>We briefly discussed the issues of 1. Workforce Development, 2. Aboriginal, Torres Strait and CALD community responsiveness - a picture of success and 3. Kindergarten Strategies beyond Kindy Conversations which have been parked for some time. These are to be put on the agenda for either the next or subsequent meeting,</p> <p>Actions: Action Group members are to forward any suggestions for amendments to the Terms of Reference to Ellen Ferris by 1 May. Ellen will then update the document and the new Terms of Reference will be confirmed at the next meeting,</p>

<p>5. Update on Lil Bug Love and Youth Music Festival Proposal</p>	<p>Cindy Barden advised that since she last came to the Chapter Lil Bug Love has distributed 250 comfort and 120 distraction kits. Also in the last 2 months in 11 trial Police Stations 80 kits have been topped up. The project is now copyrighting and trademarking and has acquired storage facilities for 2,000 kits. Cindy is talking with a bank about sponsorship of kits. She also recently received a grant to provide tablets and noise cancelling head phones and will work through a process to re-educate Police about how to use the kits. Overall 370 kids have been impacted by this initiative.</p> <p>Cindy advised that she made a good connection at ChangeFest with Uncle Noel. They spoke about how kids have lost their voice and in DV situations they feel like they don't matter. However, they can find a voice in music. So together with Uncle Noel Cindy is working on a project to co-host <i>Hear Me Now</i>, an event to be held in September – date and venue to be advised. Joel from PCYC is also on the organising committee and they are working closely with Council. Cindy has been contacting musicians to see if they are able to participate. Cindy advised that she has been speaking with some school students and has a Grade 8 class writing stories for kids. Cindy asked if Action Group members would like to be part of this and whether they had something to offer these kids. Victoria Parker suggested it might be linked with the Imagination Festival which targets the same audience and is held in September.</p> <p>Action: Action Group members who can assist or want to be involved in the organising of Hear Me Now please contact Cindy Barden lilbuglove3@gmail.com or phone: 0422 497 964.</p>
<p>6. Browns Plains LLA Update</p>	<p>Ties Warta advised that he is the LLA Facilitator for 2 LLAs – Browns Plains and Beaudesert. The main issues being identified are youth mental health, access to allied health professionals and financial literacy.</p> <p>Ties mentioned that Emerging Minds are attending the next LLA. Also LLA members are doing some work with Robert from Grand Plaza in regard to a youth engagement strategy. Robert and others from Grand Plaza have developed a relationship with 100's of kids who frequent the Plaza. They are looking to put together a working group and are working with yourtown where many of the young people attend programs. They are working on signing up shops within the centre to employ kids who finish the program. Penny Goodall suggested exploring a relationship with Centrelink. Victoria Parker advised that Grand Plaza has been keen to sign up to the Children's Charter. Also she mentioned that there was a group involving the Police that was successful in the past. Ties confirmed linkages with the Police Beat.</p>

	<p>Ties advised that there were 900 people on a wait list to see a Paediatrician and there were only 6 available who provided service on a roster basis. However, it was not clear what the issue was and whether these people actually need a Paediatrician or an allied health professional. Penny Goodall advised that this was a fundamental issue in Logan. Ties advised that it was not only access, also the needs were not accurately represented by the 900 figure as some schools or Child Safety pay for some of the visits. As the picture was not clear the LLA members are doing some scoping in this area. Matthew Cox indicated that we want to hear about issues such as this and feed it up especially where there is a systemic issue. He advised that some work had been done with major health bodies including the PHN, CHQ, Logan Hospital and others. Susan Cary spoke about a pilot project in Eagleby and Waterford involving a comprehensive screening of 2 1/2 – 3-year-old children with subsequent referrals to allied health. 400-700 children can be supported by this pilot. As this is a systemic project the question now is why can't we do this everywhere? Matthew suggested that maybe we could go to private practice Paediatricians and talk with them about the issues. Susan advised that the scope of the pilot was not Paediatricians but the pathways to them and there has been some connection with GP's. Natalie Harvey mentioned that during the pilot for ParentsNext some work was done in this area to identify issues and use PEDs assessment. Susan Cary advised that a Community of Practice is being developed starting with ECECs to use the PEDS tool effectively.</p> <p>Ties also advised that the LLA was connecting with the Logan Financial Literacy Action Group (FLAG) in regard to financial literacy issues.</p> <p>Matthew Cox indicated that for the 3 issues raised it was important for the Leadership Table to have awareness of them and also for this Action Group to determine the sort of response we have. Penny Goodall suggested including the journey for families.</p> <p>Action: Sue Jankovic and Ellen Ferris will work on the process steps to escalate to the Leadership Table, how the Action Group can support this month in and month out and connect to broader projects. They will report back to the next meeting.</p>
<p>7. G-Fit - Information sharing from community member about her project that aligns with Youth Homelessness Children Together</p>	<p>Kellie Rose was unavailable to attend. This item will be rescheduled to a later meeting.</p>

<p>8. Logan Together Wider Update</p>	<p>Under 8's Week - Victoria Parker advised that Under 8's week is 17-24 May and has the theme 'Celebrating the diversity of languages within the home, culture and community.' Simultaneous Story Time, national initiative coincides with this. This is where a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools, pre-schools, childcare centres, family homes, bookshops and many other places around the country. Work has been done to make the most of Under 8's week and encourage educators to run 30 minute sessions on the Friday Launch day. Relationships have been fostered with Grand Plaza, The Hyperdome and Maccas all of which have child friendly spaces where these sessions could be run. The next step is an EOI out to services seeking interest in engaging with kids. Angela TuiSamoa advised that KENG, The Benevolent Society, The Family Place and Uncle Barry from CfC will be</p>

	<p>involved. Kelly (Browns Plains Early Years Centre) spoke about a badge making machine that children could do use. Angela advised of some interest from an Eagleby centre that provides a Maori immersion program and could run something in language. Kim Wright mentioned that she along with others had looked at the space at The Hyperdome and provided some feedback about what was in the space and this was being progressed.</p> <p>Backing Young Parents – Penny Goodall advised that the working group is hosting 2 World's Biggest Baby Shower events in early May. This idea has been taken from the BRAVE Foundation who run this as a fundraiser. Penny advised that some young mums have joined the planning process. The details are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wednesday 8 May 1.00 - 3.00 at The Family Place - This is a Celebration Event for young parents who are already engaged with services and will be by invitation through services such as BUMP, BRAVE, Young Parents groups etc. It will have a pamper focus with gifts for parents and treats for little people plus connection with services. • Wednesday 15 May 9.00 - 11.30 Logan Central Plaza - This is a connection event with opportunities to meet with young parents. It will have a fun party feel with activities for parents and little people, gifts and some lovely 'door prizes'. <p>Family Fun Day – Angela advised that this will be held at The Family Place on 1 May.</p> <p>Deputy Director – Sue Jankovic advised that the Community Gateways, Kindy, Prep and other projects were gearing up. She is looking forward to continuing to meet people as she gets across the work happening in Logan.</p> <p>Kindy Scholarships – Victoria Parker advised that there was a small number of Kindy Scholarships available for 2020 enrolments.
